


ROKEWOOD.

Monday.
Much surprise and regret were occasioned on Saturday morning by the announcement that Mr John Chambers, the well-known coachdriver for Vines and M'Phee, had taken about an ounce of laudanum. Dr J. H. Johnson was soon in attendance, and used every remedy possible to counteract the effects of the poison, but without avail. Death took place in about seven hours and a half. An enquiry was held in the evening, before E. J. Alexander, J.P. The following verdict was arrived at, viz., "Death by syncope, result of opium poison administered by his own hand." The accused was buried in the Rokewood Cemetery on Sunday afternoon.



Some friends endeavored to remove him to his parents' residence, but owing to his becoming worse he was conveyed to the residence of Mr J. Watkins, Rokewood, where he remained until his death, which took place on Thursday night, the cause being inflammation of the lungs.
