George Appleby - Transported!

The following is an extract from the Colonial Secretary Index of Australia, concerning prisoner George Appleby who was transported to Australia in 1817 on the "Almorah"

1821 Jul 7th On list of prisoner transported to Newcastle per "Mermaid"

1822 Jan. On the monthly return of prisoners punished at Newcastle

1823 Sep 15th On list of convicts removed from Newcastle to Port Macquarie per "Mermaid"

1824 Feb 5th On list of persons proposed to be sent to Hobart

1824 Feb 9th, March 15th Convict runaway from Port Macquarie forwarded per "Woodlark" EQ334

Douglas Edward Appleby.

Douglas Appleby was born 17 May 1929, son of Robert Appleby Msc, and Muriel Surtees. He married June Marrison in 1952.

From 1957-8 he was a Company Director of The Distillers Company Ltd.; and from 1964-68 a director of the Wilkinson Sword Company. From there he moved to The Boots Company Limited in 1968-81, first as Finance Director and later Managing Director. He also served as a Regional Director of the National Westminster Bank from 1978.



New England Appleby's

The following data has been extracted from records of the New England Historical & Genealogical Register.

Wm. Appleby - included in a list of passengers for Virginia on the Speedwell of London 28th May 1635.

Thomas Appleby - listed as being chosen on 17th March 1654 as a borough head at Frampton at Lincolnshire.

Rebecca Appleby - listed in the will of Richard Baldwin 5 August 1661.

Robert & Ann Appleby - listed in the 13th April 1658 will of George Trumble both as potential beneficiaries and as a witness.

Benjamin Appleby - listed as being an American mariner (from New York) in a will dated 1742

Benjamin, Jane and Esther - listed as being the children of Benjamin Appleby (the mariner) in the same will.

Private Joseph Harold Appleby.

In issue No. 54 of *The Apple Orchard* we honoured Australian War Hero Private Joseph Harold Appleby, (service No. NX40921) who died on 14th February 1945 having been a prisoner of War in Malaya. Wayne Applebee, one of our Australian members has Emailed to say that he is related to Joseph Harold Appleby. He continues "After researching Joseph I found that not only did he serve in the 2nd World War but he also fought in the 1st War too. During the first war he was wounded several times in France. His real name and details he changed so as to enlist in the WW2 His real name was Joseph Harold Alfred Applebee. He was born at Mullaley NSW Australia on the 8th October 1896. When he enlisted in WW2 he simply changed a few minor details. He changed his birth date by 5 years to 1901 and he obviously changed the spelling of his name. I was told that this was a common practice. Researchers might do well to consider this when researching records. What was not mentioned in the details of the story, Joseph was taken prisoner and while a prisoner was tortured. It is not known if the torture lead to his death in 1945. His real age when death came was 48 years."
