We are very pleased to receive from Janet Dyas an original memorial card for Francis Appleby who died 13th January 1890 at Reighton, Yorkshire. The card gives his age as 25 but it has been altered in ink to 26. The is a poignant verse:

*Affliction sore long time I bore, Physicians were in vain,
Till God did please to give me ease, And take away my pain.*

But what are all my suffering here,

if Lord you count me meet,

With that enraptured host to appear, and worship at thy feet.

(On checking the 1881 census, we found him listed as a farm servant to William Ellyard, a farmer of 396 acres)

Willenhall, Staffordshire.

We are grateful to our member, David N. Appleby for sending us a copy of a 23 page A6 pedigree of the Appleby's of Willenhall. It is an extensive labour of love and was researched by David together with D. J. Appleby and covers from Edward (baptised 13 August 1637) and his wife Elizabeth Appleby. As previously reported, the Appleby's of Willenhall were for several generations engaged in the business of Locksmiths. *ARO/Box2/3.*

Northampton, England.

To find any Appleby's in Northamptonshire is quite a difficult task, but Jenny Reeve has conducted a Marriage Challenge for the Guild of One-Name Studies, from parish registers deposited in the Northants Record Office and came up with two marriages.

The first is for Stephen Appleby (full age bachelor) a private in the 34th regiment, son of a labourer, William Appleby and spinster Martha Elliott daughter of Henry Elliott (shoemaker) of full age. Married at St Sepulchre's Church Northampton 12th April 1843. As Stephen was in the army it is most probable that he was not a native of Northamptonshire, as we have no other records of Appleby's from Northants.

The second marriage of for Mark Appleby (25 bachelor) labourer son of John Appleby (labourer) and Charlotte Kightly aged 18 daughter of George Kightly (presser). They were married at All Saints Church Northampton on the 2nd April 1885. We have not been able to find Mark in the 1881 census, so he too may not be a native of Northants. *Doc/756.*

Private 73515 John Wm. Appleby 21st Bn. Machine Gun Corps. Gazetted on the 21st October 1918

Sgt. 79359 N. Appleby of the 1st Pioneer Bn. Can Force. Gazetted on the 23rd August 1916.
